

# MY FORTY YEARS WITH FORD

The Ford story has often been discussed in print, but it has never before been told from the inside. This startling book is truly a personal history of a business empire and a revelation that mixes with excitement and the power of tragedy.

Charles Sorensen, sometimes known as "Henry Ford's man," sometimes as "Captain Charlie," here tells his own story, and it is as challenging as it is historic. He emerges as a man who not only was one of the great production geniuses of the world but also as a man who called the plays as he saw them. He was the only man who was able to stay with Ford for almost the full history of his empire, yet he never hesitated to back that difficult master when he felt the interests of the company demanded it. He sided with labor against Henry Ford and Harry Bennett, while labor difficulties mounted and Ford's labor claims were spun him. And Sorensen insisted that Henry Ford, if he brought on to direct the company despite the aging founder's determination that no one but he should hold the presidential reins.

There is an "I was there" account of the birth of Model T, the early conflicts with the Dodge brothers, the revolutionary announcement of the five-dollar day, and Sorensen's development of the moving assembly line — a concept that has changed our world. Although Sorensen conceived, designed and built the great Willow Run plant in nineteen months and then proceeded to turn out forty-four thousand cars a year, his life's major work was to make possible the vision of Henry Ford and to preserve the personal tragedy with which it ended.

This is a tough, top-notch, gripping account with the fascination of the Titanic power and personality of a business empire.

Zetka, 1995-01-01 This book is an account of the political economy of labor relations in the U S automobile industry from the end of World War II to the 1970s Zetka develops a sophisticated paradigm of hegemonic and competitive market conditions that challenges dominant theories of postwar industrial relations linking rates of workplace militancy to product market fluctuations variations in work organization and differences in authority systems legitimated on the shop floor He then uses this model to interpret in historical detail the complex market and workplace relationships that unfolded in the industry Zetka traces the postwar struggles between management and militant auto workers over the

definition of a fair day's work. He argues that management's selective use of a quota-based authority system for occupational groups that had been the most militant during the 1940s and 1950s was primarily responsible for the decline of wildcat strike activity in the auto industry and that this system was made possible by the emergence in the 1960s of a distinctive market structure that regulated competition between the surviving auto firms.

**Friends Or Foes?** Norman E. Saul, 2006 With *Friends or Foes*, Norman Saul continues his monumental, multivolume magnum opus on U.S.-Russian relations over the course of 200 years. material from American business records on concession arrangements and commerce and on Soviet responses during the first Five Year Plan He also records travelers impressions cultural exchange and the role of academia in each country particularly the contribution of Russian migr scholars to American education and the contributions of American journalists in Russia Saul also reveals the tendency on both sides to preserve an atmosphere of secrecy conducting business behind closed doors and rarely on paper His prodigious research in the Hoover Presidential Library the Franklin Roosevelt Library and the Hoover Institution at Stanford University incorporating overlooked Diplomat Post Records and featuring an interview with George Kennan on his diplomatic role has yielded a wealth of new insights into what really happened during a period in the history of the relations between the two countries that remains mysterious and controversial Breaking new ground in diplomatic economic social and cultural history Saul s book illuminates both the mutual fascination that briefly permitted peaceful coexistence and eventual alliance and the ideological battles that ultimately led to the Cold War
