- May be categorized as “high,” “middle,” and “low” middle range theories
 - High middle range theories include broad, fairly abstract concepts.
 - Caring, transcendence, adaptation, culture
 - Middle middle range theories generally consist of theoretically defined, fairly specific constructs.
 - Uncertainty in illness, unpleasant symptoms, chronic sorrow
 - Low middle range theories are more defined and specific.
 - Women’s anger, acute pain management, intervention for postsurgical pain

Theorists themselves did not uncover or adequately discuss ways by which they developed their theories therefore the tendency was to describe processes that were based on theories developed in other disciplines mainly the physical and social sciences And an implicit assumption was made that there should be a single strategy for theory development some claiming to begin the process from practice and others believing it should be driven by research Provided by publisher
