



It was a time of delight. Glittering stars, dynamic and intimate baseball, day after day, year after year. Never again would teams and the players on those teams dominate a sport, the psyche of the fans, and the spirit of a city as did the New York City baseball teams of 1947-1957.

Except for 1948, each of those eleven years saw a New York City team competing in the World Series. The New York Yankees won nine pennants and seven World Series—five of them in a row. The Dodgers won six pennants and one World Series. The Giants won two National League championships and one World Series. Thirteen Most Valuable Player awards, eight Rookie of the Year honors, seven home run titles, five no-hitters, and four batting championships were collectively recorded by the players on those New York City teams.

Through the long and straggly nights of summer and in the blaze of its days, from early spring to the winds of autumn, baseball dominated New York City. The deeds and the personalities of the Dodgers, the Giants, and the Yankees transformed the huge metropolis into a small town of neighborhood rosters.
