An organic compound and a form of vitamin B3, an essential human nutrient

Helps to treat high cholesterol

Occurs in food with plant origin

Can be taken 1 to 3 times daily

Side Effects: Flushing and upset stomach

NICOTINAMIDE

A form of vitamin B3 found in food and used as a dietary supplement and medication

Does not help to treat high cholesterol

Occurs in the food with animal origin

Can be taken 100-300 mg daily

Side Effects: Nausea, vomiting, and other gastrointestinal symptoms, as well as headache, fatigue, and dizziness
