Question 1: A study recruited 200 cases of lung cancer and 600 matched controls. 260 participants gave a history of smoking, 180 of whom had lung cancer.

Calculate:

- a) Odds ratio of lung cancer in smokers compared to non-smokers.
- b) Assuming this was a cohort study, what would be the relative risk of lung cancer in smokers, relative compared to non-smokers?

Question 2: A cohort of 10000 persons was followed for 20 years to determine the (20-year) incidence of lung cancer; 4000 of them were smokers and 6000 were non-smokers (assume they were free of lung cancer at the beginning of the study). At the end of the follow-up period, 500 of the study subjects had developed lung cancer, 450 of whom were smokers and 50 were not.

- a) Calculate the cumulative (20-year) incidence for smokers
- b) Calculate the cumulative (20-year) incidence for non-smokers
- c) Calculate the cumulative (20-year) incidence in the general population (smokers and nonsmokers)

Question 3:

- a) Imagine a population of 25,000 people. Assuming that 5,000 of them become sick with pneumonia; and that 2,500 of these (pneumonia cases) eventually die of the disease. Calculate the following:
 - i. Morbidity rate,
 - ii. Mortality rate, and
 - iii. Case-fatality rate due to pneumonia.
- b) Of 75 persons who attended a church picnic, 46 subsequently developed a gastrointestinal illness. Calculate the attack rate of GI illness.

Question 4: In a cohort study to investigate the relationship between smoking and lung cancer, an investigator recraited 2000 persons of whom 800 were smokers and 1200 were non-smokers. The entire cohort was followed for 20 years; 100 developed lung cancer, 90 of whom were smokers and 10 were not.

- a) Construct a 2 x2 contingency table to illustrate the above study
- b) Calculate the incidence rates for smokers and non-smokers
- c) Calculate the relative risk
