“Nighthawk” is an evocative word, but among birders it does not recall the slick, haunted “night owl” figures depicted in the famous Edward Hopper painting *Nighthawks*. For birders the word summons memories of warm orange sunsets, with agile nightjars erratically tracing silhouettes across a dusk sky, hawking insects and uttering alien sounds. But by any definition, nighthawks are cool.

Cryptically clad in brown, buff, and gray, they are fantastically camouflaged at roosts during the day, when they sit on tree branches or in gravel or sandy soil. And despite their name, these are not birds of prey but are instead members of the cosmopolitan nightjar family Caprimulgidae. Species in this enigmatic family are also referred to by the colorful yet misleading name “goatsuckers,” and indeed, the word “Caprimulgidae” derives from the ancient and incorrect belief that these birds suckle milk from goats. In fact, nightjars are insectivores that use their small bills and very large mouths for capturing flying insects.

The nighthawks form a subfamily (Chordeilinae) of ten species, all confined to the New World, and compared to other nightjars, the nighthawks are more aerodynamic in shape, which facilitates their more aerial feeding habits. They also have smaller eyes and shorter rictal bristles (whiskers), and they are countershaded darker above and paler below. Not as strictly nocturnal as many other nightjars, nighthawks are sometimes active during the day, and they are most active at dusk and dawn. North American nighthawks are in the genus *Chordeiles*, which translates to “musical note at evening,”<sup>1</sup> a reference to the vociferous and

### Natural History Note:

In very cold conditions that keep insect activity low, some nightjars (such as Common Poorwill and Whip-poor-will) have developed the ability to enter a state of reduced metabolic activity akin to hibernation, known as torpor. This ability to shut down all but the most basic life functions allows them to withstand periods when food is scarce, but nighthawks apparently enter torpor uncommonly,<sup>1,2</sup> and they appear poorly adapted to areas that are not warm enough to maintain a steady supply of insects.<sup>4</sup>

crepuscular nature of these birds. In North America three species breed and each is migratory. From their nesting grounds they move south in the fall to spend winter in Central or South America, though some Lesser Nighthawks overwinter in California, Texas, and Florida. Their distribution away from breeding areas remains poorly understood, and winter sightings in the ABA Area are rare. Careful scrutiny should be applied to any vagrant nighthawk at this season.

Nighthawks are nearly always detected by voice, and in winter and fall they vocalize rarely or infrequently. Voice is also the chief means of identification, so when they aren't calling, determining species is difficult or even impossible in some cases. Fortunately, in North America nighthawks are found mainly in spring and summer, when they are vocal. Nesting and often roosting on open ground, because of their cryptic plumages they are surprisingly hard to spot in such areas. At dusk they take to the air, and in flight they move erratically but are buoyant and agile. Often seen hunting over open areas (even urban rooftops), nighthawks also frequent areas near railroad tracks or golf courses and forage over low scrub or brush.

Common Nighthawk is by far the most widespread and frequently encountered species, but Lesser Nighthawk is a common species in the arid Southwest from central California to south Texas. Antillean Nighthawk is a Caribbean species that barely reaches south Florida as a breeder and is foreign to most ABA Area birders. All three species stray on occasion, usually in autumn, and these migrants and vagrants pose real identification challenges.

Male Lesser Nighthawk, CA, Apr (BLS). Nighthawks are fascinating and enigmatic birds, unfamiliar to many birders because of their crepuscular nature, camouflaged plumage, and day-roosting behavior. Best identified by voice, they can be silent during migration, when several species' ranges overlap, making identification difficult. Subtle structural and plumage characters often help sort out silent birds, but distinguishing between Common and Antillean nighthawks is all but impossible, unless their vocalizations are heard.
