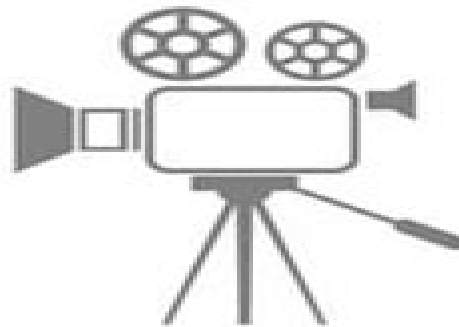


Behind the Silver Screen - Producing Movies in the 1920s
