site itself is situated at the foot of a high steep sided dune on the eastern edge of a large sand valley close to the western shore of Loch Cill Donnain The archaeological report of the excavation at the Cill Donnain wheelhouse shows that in comparison with contemporary neighbouring settlements it was unlikely that each was an independent unit and that they were linked by social and economic inter dependency.
