Broyld, 2022-05-25 Winner of the OHS and his willingness to resort to extremist methods Fred Landon Award In the early nineteenth century Rochester New York and St Catharines Canada West were the last stops on the Niagara branch of the Underground Railroad Both cities handled substantial fugitive slave traffic and were logical destinations for the settlement of runaways because of their progressive stance on social issues including abolition of slavery women's rights and temperance Moreover these urban centers were home to sizable free Black communities as well as an array of individuals engaged in the abolitionist movement such as Frederick Douglass Harriet Tubman Anthony Burns and Hiram Wilson dann j Broyld's Borderland Blacks explores the status and struggles of transient Blacks within this dynamic zone where the cultures and interests of the United States Canada Great Britain and the African Diaspora overlapped Blacks in the two cities shared newspapers annual celebrations religious organizations and kinship and friendship ties Too often historians have focused on the one way flow of fugitives on the Underground Railroad from America to Canada when in fact the situation on the ground was far more fluid involving two way movement and social collaborations Black residents possessed transnational identities and strategically positioned themselves near the American Canadian border where immigration and interaction occurred Borderland Blacks reveals that physical separation via formalized national barriers did not sever concepts of psychological memory or restrict social ties Broyld investigates how the times and terms of emancipation affected Blacks on each side of the border including their use of political agency to pit the United States and British Canada against one another for the best possible outcomes Lives and Times Blaine T. Godine revives this history with stirring stories of frontier life and racial justice She puts the vote seeking Black pioneers at the heart of the Adirondack narrative At long last their shaping role has been reclaimed William Lloyd Garrison and Giuseppe Mazzini Enrico Dal Lago, 2013-11-11 William Lloyd Garrison and Giuseppe Mazzini two of the foremost radicals of the nineteenth century lived during a time of profound economic social and political transformation in America and Europe Both born in 1805 but into dissimilar family backgrounds the American Garrison and Italian Mazzini led entirely different lives one as a citizen of a democratic republic the other as an exile proscribed by most European monarchies Using a comparative analysis Enrico Dal Lago suggests that Garrison and Mazzini nonetheless represent a connection between the egalitarian ideologies of American abolitionism and Italian democratic nationalism Focusing on Garrison's and Mazzini's activities and transnational links within their own milieus and in the wider international arena Dal Lago shows why two nineteenth century progressives and revolutionaries considered liberation from enslavement and liberation from national oppression as two sides of the same coin At different points in their lives both Garrison and Mazzini demonstrated this belief by concurrently supporting the abolition of slavery in the United States and the national revolutions in Italy The two meetings Garrison and Mazzini had in 1846 and in 1867 served to reinforce their sense that they somehow worked together toward the achievement of liberty not just in the United States and Italy but also in the Atlantic and Euro American world as a whole In the end the abolition of American slavery led to Garrison's consecration while the new Italian kingdom forced Mazzini into exile Despite these different outcomes Garrison and Mazzini both attracted legions of devoted followers who believed these men personified the radical causes of the nations to which they belonged Touching America's History Meredith Mason Brown, 2014-01-01 Objects that make the past feel real from a stone axe head to a piece of John Brown's scaffold includes photos History isn t just about abstract isms it s the story of real events that happened to real people In Touching America s History Meredith Mason Brown uses a collection of such objects drawing from his own family s heirlooms to summon up major developments in America's history.
