class.



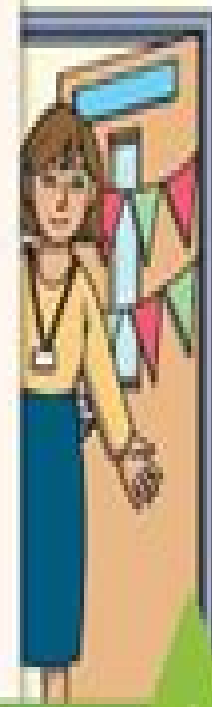
Listen
