Since ancient times the most important foods in the Mexican diet have been corn beans squash tomatillos and chile peppers. The role of these ingredients in Mexican food culture through the centuries is the basis of this volume. Surveys of class and regional differences in typical meals and cuisines present insight into the daily lives of a wide variety of Mexicans. The Mexican way of life is also illuminated in chapters on eating out whether at the omnipresent street stalls or at fondas and special occasions including the main fiestas and rites of passage. A final chapter on diet and health discusses current health concerns particularly malnutrition anemia diabetes and obesity.
