

THE LOGIC OF THE SOCIAL
SCIENCES

I propose to begin my paper on the logic of the social sciences with two theses which express the contrast between our knowledge and our ignorance.

First thesis: We have a fair amount of knowledge. Moreover, we know not only details of detailed intellectual interest, but also, and more especially, things that are not only of considerable practical importance, but also, in addition, provide us with deep theoretical insight, and with a surprising understanding of the world.

Second thesis: Our ignorance is boundless and unending. Indeed, it is precisely this overwhelming progress of the natural sciences (in which my first thesis alludes) that continually reminds us of our ignorance, even in the field of the natural sciences themselves.

My lecture was supposed to mention Adorno's book *On Authority* but I was unable to do so. I have in my possession a copy in which he eventually agreed with me. However, when the book *The Authoritarian Personality* in German language was published, Adorno began with one polemical point, which together with some already well-known points that I must say I have followed up Adorno's supplementary paper and by which the book was given a new perspective. It is not unlikely that anyone reading the book *The Authoritarian Personality* would suppose that my lecture had opened the debate on the Adorno's supposed opening first draft paper and I have a strong suspicion myself as to the result.*

Translator's note: The main body of Adorno's translation took place in the German edition of *The Authoritarian Personality*, the English edition was by E. E. Schattschneider (1940) (M. G. S., London, 1950) of the *Authoritarian Personality*. However, it has been revised and amended for the edition especially in those places where the German edition noticeably lacks in English.

This gives a new twist to the familiar idea of ignorance. With each step forward with every problem we solve, we not only discover new and unthought problems, but we also discover that just when we believed that we were standing on firm and solid ground, all things are, in reality, insecure and unstable.

Of course, my two theses about knowledge and ignorance only appear to contradict one another. The chief cause of this apparent contradiction lies in the fact that the word 'knowledge' is used in a rather different sense in each of the two theses. Yet both senses are important, and so are both theses so much so that I propose to make this explicit in the following third thesis.

Third thesis: Every theory of knowledge has a fundamentally important task, which may even be regarded as its crucial test: it must do justice to our first two theses by clarifying the relation between our reasonable and constantly increasing knowledge and our constantly increasing insight that in reality we know nothing.

If we give it a little thought, it goes almost without saying that the logic of knowledge must address this tension between knowledge and ignorance. An important consequence of this insight is formulated in my fourth thesis. But before I present this fourth thesis, I should like to apologise for the many dashes that are still to come. My excuse is that it was suggested to me that I assemble this paper in the form of numbered dashes. I found this suggestion very useful despite the fact that this rule may cause the impression of digressions. Here, then, is my fourth thesis.

Fourth thesis: So far as one can say at all that science or knowledge starts from something, one might say the following: Knowledge does not start from perceptions or observations or the collection of data or facts; it starts, rather, from problems. One might say: No knowledge without problems; but also, no problems without knowledge. But this means that knowledge starts with the tension between knowledge and ignorance: No problems without knowledge - no problems without ignorance. For every problem arises from the discovery that there is something which within our supposed knowledge or viewed logically, from the discovery of an inner contradiction in our supposed knowledge, or of a contradiction between our supposed knowledge and the facts or, to be more accurate, from the discovery of an apparent contradiction between our supposed knowledge and the supposed facts.

The Logic of Social Science James Mahoney, 2021-08-17 Mahoney's starting point is the problem of essentialism in social science. Essentialism is the belief that the members of a category possess hidden properties, essences that make them members of the category and that endow them with a certain nature. This is appropriate for scientific categories, atoms for instance, but not for human ones, revolutions for instance. Despite this, much social science research takes place from within an essentialist orientation. Those who reject this assumption go so far in the other direction as to reject the idea of an external reality independent of human beings altogether. Mahoney proposes an alternative approach that aspires to bridge this enduring rift in the social sciences between those who take a scientific approach and assume that social science categories correspond to external reality and thus believe that the methods used in the natural sciences are generally appropriate for the social sciences, and those who take a constructivist approach and believe that because the categories used to understand the social world are humanly constructed, they cannot possibly follow the science of the natural world. As the name suggests, scientific constructivism brings in aspects of both views and attempts to unite them. Drawing from cognitive science, it focuses on using the rational parts of our brain machinery to overcome the limitations and deeply seated biases such as essentialism of our evolved minds. Specifically, Mahoney puts forth a set-theoretic analysis that focuses on sets of categories as they exist in the mind, that are also subject to the mathematical logic of set theory. He spends the first four chapters of the book establishing the foundations and methods for set-theoretic analysis, the next four chapters looking at how this analysis fits with the existing tools of social science, and the final four chapters focusing on how this approach can be used to study and understand cases.
