Throughout history, the notion of culture has had different meanings and nuances. For many centuries, it was a concept that was inseparable from religion and theological knowledge; in Greece it was characterized by philosophy and in Rome by law, while during the Renaissance it was imbued with literature and the arts. In more recent times, like the Enlightenment, it was science and great scientific discoveries that gave the idea of culture its particular slant. But despite these variations, and right up to the present day, culture has always signified a combination of factors and disciplines that, according to a broad social consensus, are what defines it: a recognition of a shared heritage of ideas, values, and works of art; a store of historical, philosophical, and religious knowledge in constant evolution; and the exploration of new artistic and literary forms and of research in all areas of knowledge.

Culture always established social levels between those people who cultivated it and enriched it through their different contributions and those who showed no interest in it, scorned it, or were ignorant of it, or who were excluded from it for social and economic reasons. In every historical period, up to our own, there were cultured and uncultured people and, between these two extremes, people who were more or less cultured and more or less uncultured, and this classification was quite clear the world over, because there was a shared system of values and cultural criteria, and shared ways of thinking, judging, and behaving.

In our day and age, all this has changed. The idea of culture has broadened to such an extent that, although nobody would dare to state this explicitly, it has disappeared. It has become an ungraspable, multitudinous, and figurative ghost, because nobody is cultured if everyone thinks that they are, or if the content of what we call culture has been corrupted to such an extent that everyone can justifiably think that they are indeed cultured.
