Online Reading Intervention:

The Efficacy of a Synchronous Online Reading Fluency Intervention with Struggling Readers Tosca van Duijnen, 2021 The efficacy of reading interventions on elementary students decoding and word reading skills and reading comprehension has been well established in the literature The efficacy of online reading interventions however is unknown This study adapted an in person reading fluency intervention for synchronous online implementation and examined its effectiveness in a single case research design Three struggling readers in grades 2 and 3 participated in an 8 week online reading intervention Pre test post test and progress monitoring data were collected and analyzed The results indicated that the online RAVE O intervention was effective in increasing the participants accurate word reading and decoding skills as well as their reading comprehension The adapted intervention was implemented with fidelity and maintained its efficacy in an online setting For struggling readers who cannot access intervention resources in person an online reading intervention such as the one used in this study could have a positive effect on their reading skills

Adapting Reading Intervention for Online Students

Baiyun Chen, Atsusi Hirumi, 2004 With the advances of computer and network technologies student enrollment in distance education has increased rapidly since the 1990s In 2003 it is estimated that about 40 000 to 50 000 K 12 students are enrolled in online courses nationwide Golden Wicks Williams 2004 With the ever increasing number of K 12 students who attend online program researchers state in a report on virtual school in United States that online education program s already are having a significant impact on public education Watson Winograd Kalmon May 2004 Most likely the K 12 online programs will take an increasingly important role in the school system of the United States According to Building a Snapshot of Virtual Schools Across the Nation by Collins 12 states have established online high school programs and 5 others are developing them 25 states allow for the creation of so called cyber charter schools and 32 states have e learning initiatives under way Collins 2004 In the future the option of e learning will be available to every child for purposes of advanced study credit recovery or remedial learning The target population of a virtual school encompasses gifted students students seeking credit recovery and at risk and dropout students The focus of this paper is the problematic students who do not succeed in traditional classroom The at risk and dropout student population size is shockingly large The primary purpose of this paper is to explore and elaborate these issues and to develop and test an online reading intervention module for problematic secondary students to improve their reading abilities

The Effects of Using an Online Reading Program to Improve Learning for Special Education Students Ryan Scott Saxe, 2020 Modern day instructional tools such as technology and digital learning programs have been created to assist teachers in differentiating instruction for struggling students and catching students up who are not proficient in reading The Coronavirus 2020 Global Pandemic forced schools and classrooms across the world to move to remote and virtual forms of learning which potentially exacerbates the achievement gap between all students and students with identified learning disabilities The purpose of this casual comparative quantitative research study was to determine the extent to which a digital learning program improves learning outcomes in reading for 4th grade special education students from 32 elementary schools in two West Virginia school districts For this study a convenience sample of 120 learning disabled students was used which was comprised of 60 special education students that received one year of i Ready instruction and 60 students that received no i Ready instruction and instead used a non digital teacher led intervention program for instruction To determine if there is a significant difference in reading achievement on the West Virginia General Summative Assessment of 4th grade special education students who use i Ready as a reading intervention tool compared to 4th grade special education students who do not use i Ready as a reading intervention tool an independent t test was conducted The independent sample t test determined that there is a significant difference between the means of special education students who received i Ready instruction and special education students who did not receive i Ready instruction program and instead used a teacher led intervention for instruction The results of this study conclude that the i Ready program is associated with improved reading scores for students with learning disabilities
