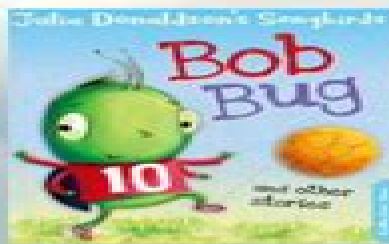
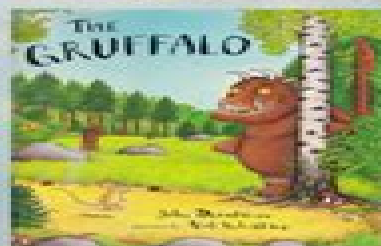


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Reading in the Digital Age: Young Children's Experiences with E-books Ji Eun Kim, Brenna
