Injuries at early age are some of the common causes of childhood disability and death in the United States. A high mortality rate due to suicide, poisoning and falls has been observed since the past decade. Motor Vehicle Injuries (MVAs) and suicide are two major causes of injury mortality. Other common injuries include head injuries, drowning, burns and firearm injuries. In the pedestrian injuries to children, a number of motor vehicle-related injuries and deaths have been recorded. Burn and drowning are two leading causes of increase in childhood mortality rate. The rate of injuries is higher in the children younger than 9. The probability of most fatal injuries is high in later childhood and adolescence.

Underlying Principles

The circumstances around the injury type as directly related to child's growth and development. Child's curiosity increases with time and urges him to investigate everything. This innate curiosity can lead a child to serious issues. Some children with difficult temperament, persistence and high activity level are prone to injuries. Stress can also be a factor in increasing the risk of injuries in children. They are at risk due to lack of attention by patients and self-destructive behavior. The misunderstanding between his age and activities can also lead to injuries. Some underlying causes of childhood injuries are, curiosity about the environment, desire to set their own rules, they want their acceptance. Infants have different reasons behind injuries. They try to feel their environment by touch and taste. Fall injuries are common among them. Different underlying causes of injuries can be observed in children of different age groups.

Consultation and advocacy is required in childhood injury prevention. Teachings are required for injury prevention. The understanding of the magnitude and impact of injuries is required for further action for injury prevention. In case of any injury, immediate action by the health professionals is required. Identification of unsafe products is required. Rules should be set for children of every age group and healthcare professionals take responsibility to convey the message. Children of older than one year are at more risk of injuries so nurses play an important role. A developmental approach can be used for the counseling of parents and children to prevent injuries. Proper prevention tips are the part of routine patient care in most of the healthcare setups.
